**Volunteers Gather at the General Meeting in Celebration of TSRHC 90th Birthday**

On Saturday, May 14, Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children (TSRHC) held its General Meeting for volunteers in the T. Boone Pickens Training and Conference Center. The hospital's 90th birthday was the theme for the lunch meeting, which was attended by 240 volunteers. The General Meeting celebrates the hospital's volunteers and recognizes those who have served for a number of years, or reached a milestone in hours of service. Two major awards—the Samson Wiener Award and the Paul Taylor, D.D.S, Trailrider Award—are presented at the meeting. Important business is also conducted at the meeting, as new officers of the hospital's Volunteer Executive Committee are elected.

In keeping with the theme, the hospital was decorated for a birthday party, with balloons and a large cake greeting volunteers, staff and other guests as they arrived. A delicious lunch of steak with artichoke sauce and salad was served, and volunteers also

enjoyed a special dessert—chocolate cake with a birthday candle! Some volunteers even sang an impromptu verse of "Happy Birthday" to TSRHC. The hospital's 90 years of caring for children and the importance of its volunteers were highlighted during the

welcome and opening remarks of Bob Walker, TSRHC vice president and administrator. Volunteers have played a vital role at TSRHC from the hospital's beginning and continue to do so today. In the last year, volunteers contributed more than 108,000 hours of service to TSRHC. Volunteers who have reached certain levels of hours or tenure, contributing to that grand total, were recognized with 75-hour pins, tenure bars and recognition on the Hours Board.

Special thanks were given to Marilyn Phillips, who has volunteered at the hospital for 35 years. Ms. Phillips has volunteered throughout the hospital, most recently in the surgery area. Bob Mason and Margaret Stockton were recognized for 25 years of TSRHC volunteer service. Tenure pins were also awarded to hospital volunteers who have provided 20, 15 and 10 years of service.

Recognition was also given to volunteers who have contributed an exceptional number of hours to the

Dear TSRHC Volunteers,

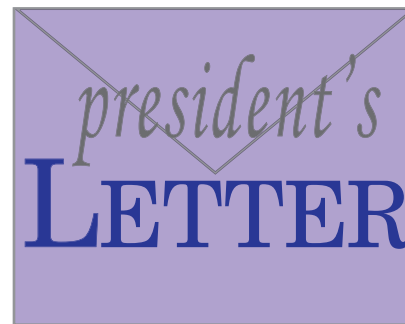

## Award Recipients

### Samson Wiener Award

The Samson Wiener Volunteer of the Year Award was awarded this year to William "Bill" Marble. The award is named in honor of Samson Weiner, a 33rd-degree Mason who served Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children (TSRHC) for more than 40 years, initially as a volunteer reading to young patients and eventually as vice-chairman of the TSRHC Board of Trustees. The award was established in his name in 1985, and is presented annually to an individual or group who has demonstrated exemplary commitment to TSRHC patients through meritorious voluntary service.

This year's Paul Taylor, D.D.S., Trailrider Award was presented at the General Meeting to volunteer Bruce Neustadt. This award was established in 2004 and named in honor of Paul Taylor, D.D.S., who served on the hospital's dental staff for 40 years and continued to support the dental service after his retirement in 1986. The award is presented each year to a volunteer whose tenacity and long-standing commitment to the hospital merits recognition.

Mr. Neustadt has volunteered at TSRHC for more than 22 years and has provided more than 4,400 hours of service to the hospital. He is an evening volunteer who is always willing to help where he is needed, whether it is the front desk, the snack cart or reading to a patient. He has been active as a special events volunteer as well, supporting the hospital at many events, including the Dallas White Rock Marathon, the Katy Trail 5K, Treasure Street and TSRHC night at the

Mesquite Championship Rodeo. Mr. Neustadt also provides tours of the hospital and promotes it at every turn. He is a Mason who always shares information about hospital events and donor opportunities at his Masonic Lodge, and he is a great recruiter of new volunteers. He also works to improve things for patients and volunteers, and served on a committee that chose the new volunteer uniform in 2008. ### 2011-2012 Volunteer Executive Committee Officers



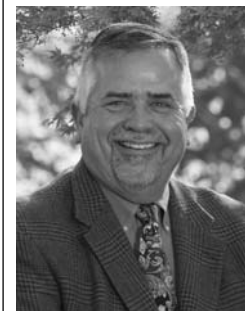

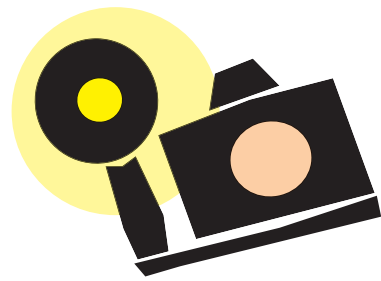
